## Signs and Symbols

Masonry is full of signs and symbols and they are meant to have relevance to our lives. As humans, we tend to know what we want to do but at times we find ourselves deviating from our principals and regretting decisions and actions made in "the moment." How many times have we said to ourselves, "sheesh, what was I thinking?"

In religion, there tends to be punishment tied to ungodly behavior. If you sin, you are going to be punished, or you will be cast out of God's presence. Religion then starts to list the sins and points out the actions and thoughts that may separate you from your God. Some religious teachings explain what sins are and tell you not to commit them, but if you do, here is the list of things that you must do to get right with God.

Masonry is not a religion. Its teachings are based on some biblical principles but also on some basic instruction of how you should live your life and how you should treat your fellow man. There is no religious wrath that will be brought upon the Mason for a lack of adherence to Masonic teachings. There may be some kind of cause and effect that might befall the Mason that doesn't practice the precepts and lessons taught him, but then again, maybe not.


What I have found is that treating your fellow man "by the square" is likely to keep you out of trouble. It will probably improve the relationships that you have. It may even make it easier to fall asleep with a clear conscience. "By the square" means that you should treat your fellow man in a way that you wish someone would treat you in a similar situation.

Now that we know what treating someone "by the square" is, using a symbol to help us remember how we should act can be helpful. We remember that our obligations to each other are made by placing our hand on the square. It is no small matter that we have the square as one of the principal symbols of Masonry.

Treating someone in a manner that you would like someone to treat you, if you were in similar circumstances, may go against our selfish nature, but in reality, we are better served by serving others. Our lives will be richer and more blessed by remembering the square and what it means to act "by the square."

In our Masonic symbolism oil is associated with corn and wine as an element of consecration and as wages of a Fellow Craft. In the 133rd Psalm oil and dew are associated as symbols of God's blessings, and in some other Biblical passages dew is substituted for oil in connection with corn and wine as symbols of blessing.

*Gen.* 27:28 "Therefore God gave thee of the dew of Heaven, and the fatness of the earth, and plenty of corn and wine."

*Deut.* 33:28 "Isreal then shall dwell in safety alone: the fountain of Jacob shall be upon a land of corn and wine; also his Heavens shall drop down due."

However, there is a difference - dew is the symbol of heavenly blessings; oil of earthly joy. Oil is the material result of the spiritual dew.
